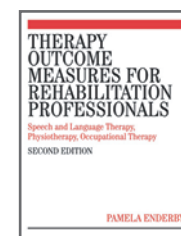

About the Presenter

Dr Alexandra John is an honorary researcher at the School of Health and Related Research, University of Sheffield, Great Ormond Street Hospital, London and the Institute of Child Health, University College London. Dr John studied Speech and Language Therapy in Edinburgh and after working as a Speech and Language Therapist and as a Service manager, she moved into research. Dr John has a Masters Degree from City University, London and a PhD from the University of Sheffield.

Dr John's research interests are in evaluation of quality in health and the development and use of outcome measures in the therapy professions. She is a co-author with Professor Enderby of the Therapy Outcome Measure for the therapy professions. She has collaborated with Professor Pam Enderby and Australian colleagues on the development of an Australian version of the TOM, OZ-TOM. Dr John worked with Speech and Language specialists in Cleft Palate in the UK and Ireland to develop a valid and reliable Cleft Audit Protocol for Speech (CAPS-A). This is a national audit tool for auditing 5 and 10 year old children born with cleft lip/palate. Dr John has run training courses in the use of the TOMs and the CAPS-A. Research work has focused on linking process to outcome, the use of benchmark data to evaluate the outcomes of care and the use of audit to promote standards. Publications include articles, conference presentations and research project reports on outcomes of care using qualitative and quantitative measures.

About the Workshop

The workshop will provide participants with tools to collect and measure outcomes data on clients receiving treatments. This will include their own copy of Prof Pam Enderby and Dr Alex John's manual: *'Therapy Outcome Measures for Rehabilitation Professionals: Speech and Language Therapy, Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy, 2nd Edition'* (see below).

The day will include both theoretical and practical components.

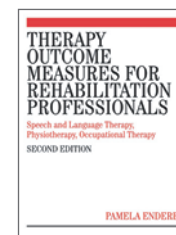
Learning Outcomes
